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

Introduction

The scope of this Startup Guide is to detail the processes of receiving and installing the Keysight M9362AD01 PXIe Microwave Quad Downconverter, installing the required software, and verifying basic module operation. If you have any questions after reviewing this information, contact your local Keysight Technologies representative.

M9362AD01 Introduction

Definitions for Specifications

Specifications describe the warranted performance of calibrated instruments that have been stored for a minimum of 2 hours within the operating temperature range of 0 to 55°C, unless otherwise stated, and after a 45 minute warm-up period. Data represented in this document are specifications unless otherwise noted.

Characteristics describe product performance that is useful in the application of the product, but that is not covered by the product warranty. Characteristics are often referred to as Typical or Nominal values. Characteristic are represented in italics.

- Nominal describes representative performance that is useful in the application of the product when operated over a 20 to 30 °C temperature range. Nominal performance is not warranted.
- Typical describes characteristic performance, which 80% of instruments are expected to meet when operated over a 20 to 30 °C temperature range. Typical performance is not warranted.

Step 1: Unpack and Inspect the Module

CAUTION

The module is shipped in materials which prevent damage from static. The module should only be removed from the packaging in an anti-static area ensuring that correct anti-static precautions are taken. Store all modules in anti-static envelopes when not in use.

Electrostatic discharge (ESD) can damage or destroy electronic components. The module is shipped in materials which prevent damage from static, and should only be removed from the packaging in an anti-static area ensuring that the correct anti-static precautions are taken.

Two types of ESD protection are listed below. Purchase acceptable ESD accessories from your local supplier.

- Conductive table-mat and wrist-strap combination
- Conductive floor-mat and heal-strap combination

Both types, when used together, provide a significant level of ESD protection. To ensure user safety, static-safe accessories must provide at least 1 $M\Omega$ of isolation from ground.

WARNING

These techniques for a static-safe work station should not be used when working on circuitry with a voltage potential greater than 500 volts.

Inspect for Damage

After unpacking a module, carefully inspect it for any shipping damage. Report any damage to the shipping agent immediately, as such damage is not covered by the warranty. Refer to "Keysight Support, Services, and Assistance" on page 33. Keep the damaged shipping materials (if any) for inspection by the carrier and an Keysight Technologies representative.

Power up the Controller

CAUTION

If you are using a remote controller and you have installed the interface cable, you must power up the chassis <u>BEFORE</u> you power up the PC. When you power down your chassis, shut down the PC <u>BEFORE</u> you power down the chassis.

If you are using an embedded controller, complete the following steps:

- 1. Install the embedded controller into the chassis. The Keysight M9306A PXIe Embedded Controller and Keysight M9018A PXIe Chassis are recommended. Refer to the controller and chassis documentation for details.
- 2. Connect peripherals (mouse, keyboard and monitor).
- 3. Power up the chassis.

Install the Software

This installation includes the following software:

NOTE Version 16.1 (or newer) of the Keysight IO Libraries Suite is required.

- Keysight IO Libraries Suite (IOLS), which includes the Keysight Connections Expert, is included with your shipment (CD part number E2904-60003), and is also available at http://www.keysight.com/find/iosuite.
- Instrument software, which includes device drivers and user documentation, is included with your shipment (CD part number M9499-10008), and is also available at http://www.keysight.com/find/M9362AD01.

Software Installation Procedure

This installation includes the following software:

Use the following procedure to install the software:

- 1. From the Keysight IOLS CD (E2904-60003) browser launch the installer.
- 2. Follow the installer prompts to install the IO libraries.
- 3. From the M9362AD01 Software and Product Information CD (M9499-10008) launch the installer.
- 4. After installation is complete, power down the host PC, and then the chassis if using a remote controller.

CAUTION

If you are using a remote controller, shut down the PC <u>BEFORE</u> you power down the chassis. When you restore power, power up the chassis <u>BEFORE</u> you power up the PC.

Step 4: Install the Module

CAUTION

PXI hardware does not support "hot-swap" capabilities (changing modules while power is applied to the chassis). Before installing a module into the chassis, the chassis must be powered off to prevent damage to the module.

NOTE

This Module can be used in a chassis with a PXIe and PXI-H hybrid slots.




The M9352A can also be installed in any hybrid PXI slot marked with a peripheral slot compatibility image (the letter "H" and a solid circle containing the slot number).

- 1. Make sure that the line cord is plugged in to establish earth ground and that the chassis power switch is in the Off (Standby) position.
- 2. If the chassis has multiple fan speed settings, ensure that the fans are set to automatic.
- 3. Position the chassis so that there is ample space between the chassis fan intake and exhaust vents. Blockage by walls or obstructions affects the air flow needed for cooling. (Refer to the chassis documentation for more information about cooling).
- 4. Before installing a module, be sure to remove the plastic thread protectors from the mounting screws. Before inserting the module into the chassis, back the mounting screws out to ensure that there is no interference between the screws and the mounting rails.
- 5. Holding the module by the injector/ejector handle, slide it into an available PXI (or hybrid) slot, as shown in Figure 3 on page 10.
 - a. Install the module into the PXI slot of the chassis by placing the module card edges into the front module guides (top and bottom).
 - b. Slide the module to the rear of the chassis and ensure that the injector/ejector handle is pushed down in the unlatched (downward) position.
 - c. Slide the module completely into the chassis. When you begin to feel resistance, push up on the injector/ejector handle to fully insert the module into the chassis.

- 6. Secure the front panel to the chassis using the two module front-panel mounting screws. Performance may suffer if the screws are not tightened properly.
- 7. Verify that the PXI chassis fans are operable and free of dust and other contaminants that may restrict airflow.
- 8. Install all filler panels after installing the module. Missing filler panels may disrupt necessary air circulation in the chassis.
- 9. If you are using a PC host, such as the Keysight M9021, connect the Cable Interface in the chassis to the PC host per the instructions that came with the Cable Interface.
- 10. Power up the PXI chassis.
- 11.Reboot the PC host.

CAUTION

The maximum input to any of the RF Input connectors (A, B, C, or D) must not exceed +18 dBm with 0 VDC offset. The maximum input to the LO Input connector must not exceed +5 dBm with 0 VDC offset.

RF Inputs (A, B, C or D)

This APC 3.5 mm female connector inputs a signal (10 MHz to 26.5 GHz, at a maximum of +18 dBm with 0 VDC offset) that will be downconverted and directed to IF Output A, B, C or D.

IF Outputs (A, B, C or D)

This SMA female connector outputs an IF signal (0.01 to 1.5 GHz) that is derived from the RF Input A, B, C or D.

LO Input

This APC 3.5 mm female connector inputs a signal (10 MHz to 26.5 GHz, at a maximum of +5 dBm with 0 VDC offset) that is used as the LO to downconvert the RF Inputs A, B, C or D and to provide a buffered LO Output.

LO Output

This APC 3.5 mm female connector outputs a signal (10 MHz to 26.5 GHz) that can be used as the LO Input to an additional M9362AD01 PXIe Microwave Quad Downconverter.

RF Inputs (A, B, C or D)

This 1.85 mm female connector inputs a signal (10 MHz to 40 GHz, at a maximum of +10 dBm with 0 VDC offset) that will be downconverted and directed to IF Output A, B, C or D.

IF Outputs (A, B, C or D)

This SMA female connector outputs an IF signal (0.01 to 3 GHz) that is derived from the RF Input A, B, C or D.

LO Input

Figure 7 F26 Conversion Efficiency





Figure 8 F40 Conversion Efficiency








Figure 10 F50 Conversion Efficiency (High Band)




Figure 11 F26 IF Band wid th




Figure 12 F40 and F50 IF Band width (Low Band)

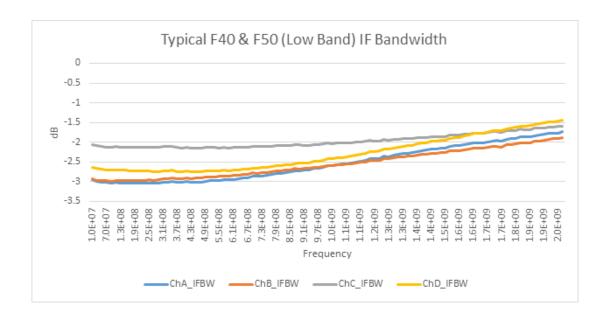


Figure 13 F50 IF Band width (High Band)





Figure 14 F26 LO IN to LO OUT Through



Operational Procedure

The following procedure was created using a PNA. The PNA uses its two internal sources, one for the RF and the second as the LO signals. The PMAR (Power Meter As Receiver) measurement method was chosen to characterize the IF Output performance. The M9362AD01 performance can be checked against the Output Power characteristics in "General Characteristics" on page 17. This procedure assumes the operator or user knows how to use the PNA.

The Operational Procedure can also be verified using two separate PSG sources, one for the RF and a second for the LO. Use a power meter to measure the IF Output. The M9362AD01 performance can be checked against the output power characteristics in the technical specifications in Table 5 on page 17.

Performance can very. This is a simple operator procedure that verifies that the unit is functional. This procedure should not be used for measuring the units typical characteristic as hard specifications.

NOTE	Optimum RF and LO power levels can found in Table 5 on page 17.
NOTE	Option F40 will require an amplifier to ensure the LO power is set at 10 dBm. Use of an attenuator maybe required.

Figure 15 PMAR Set on the PNA




Figure 16 Select Measure




Figure 17 Source and Attenuator Settings




Figure 18 F26 and F50 (Low Band) Frequency Offset




Figure 19 F40 Frequency Offset




Figure 20 F50 (High Band) Frequency Offset




Figure 21 F26 and F50 (Low Band) OP Conversion Efficiency




Figure 22 F40 OP Conversion Efficiency






Figure 23 F50 (High Band) OP Conversion Efficiency



Figure 24 M9362AD01 Block Diagram (Option F26)






