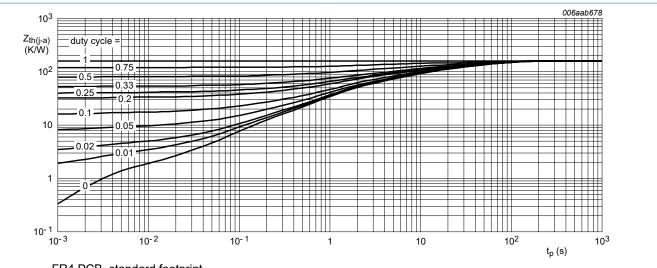

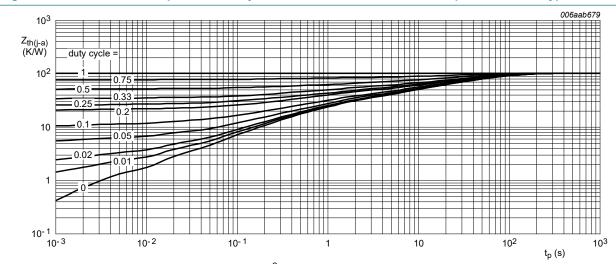

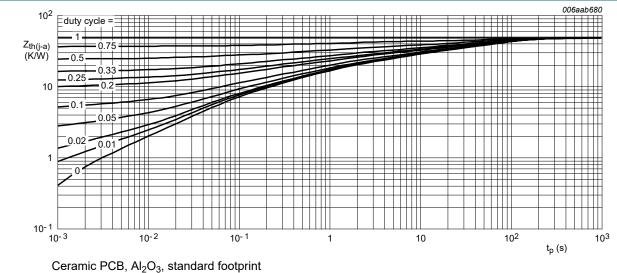
FR4 PCB, standard footprint

Fig. 2. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values



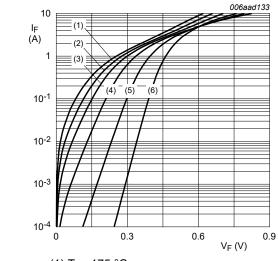
Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values Fig. 3.

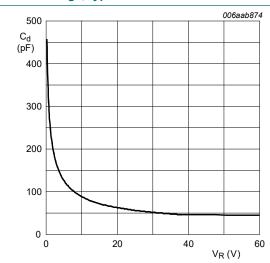

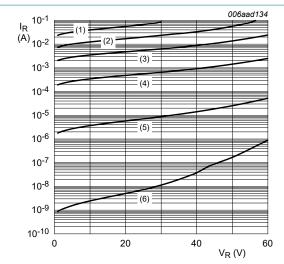

Diode capacitance as a function of reverse Fig. 6. voltage; typical values



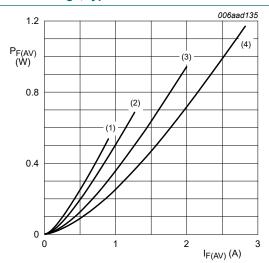

Fig. 5. Reverse current as a function of reverse voltage; typical values



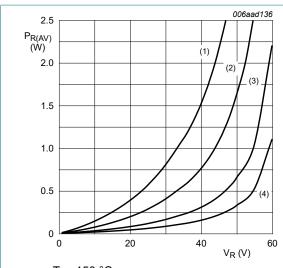

Fig. 7. Average forward power dissipation as a function of average forward current; typical values



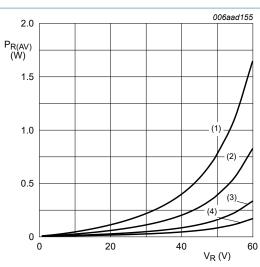

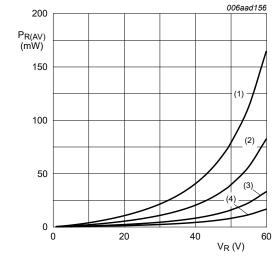

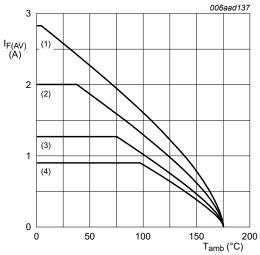

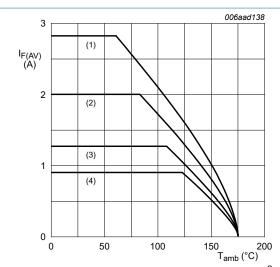

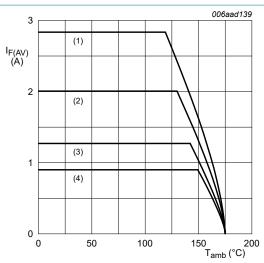

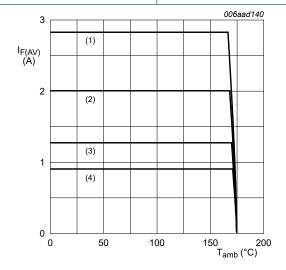

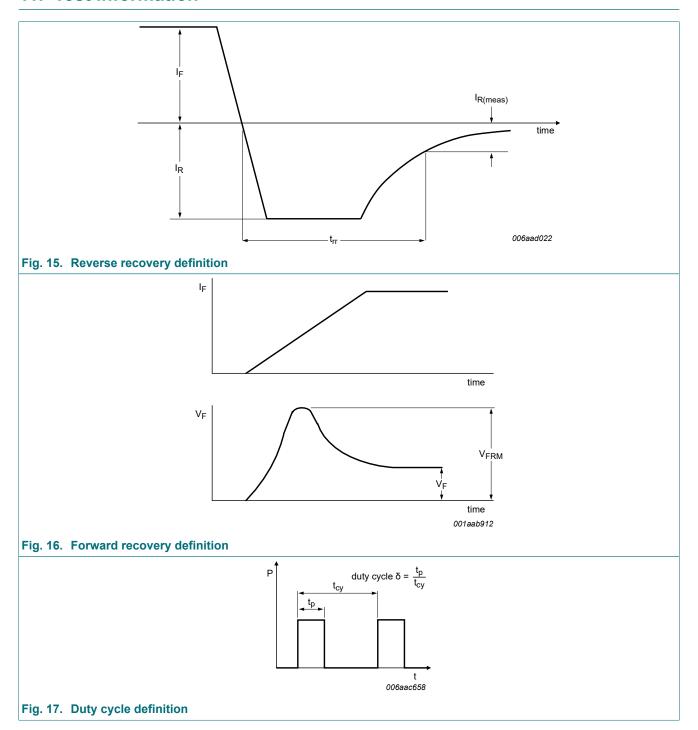
